CURBSIDE TRASH PICKUP...

Garbage Curbside Collection

Garbage, recycling, and yard waste are all collected on the same day. Place your garbage cart curbside by 7 am on your scheduled collection day.

Remove your garbage cart from the curb between collection days (remove by 9 pm on the day collection has occurred).

Please follow these instructions...

- Leave at least 4 feet of clearance on all sides of your cart.
- Obstructions such as recycle bins, yard waste, bulk items, mail boxes, poles etc. may prevent the automated truck from emptying your cart.
- Set your garbage cart within 4 feet of the curb or the traveled edge of the road, with the front of the cart facing the street. So that the mechanical arm on the garbage truck can reach the cart.
- Do not place your cart in the street or in the path of mail trucks. Do not block the driveway of your neighbors or block the sidewalk.



You may be eligible for back-door service at no additional charge if you have a disability or other physical limitation. Please call 352-338-3233 for more information.

Holidays

Only these six holidays will affect collection service:

New Year's Day Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Birthday **Memorial Day** July 4th **Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day**

Collection for these holidays and the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day if the observed holiday occurs on a weekday. Collection will return to the normal schedule the following week. Collection will not be delayed if the holiday falls on the weekend.

Trash carts and recycling bins placed curbside will be emptied once a week. Call the Office of Waste Collection 352-338-3233 to find out your designated collection day.

Be Cart Smart!

Please follow these guidelines:

- X Do not overfill your garbage cart. Garbage should not exceed the height of the top rim of your cart.
- X Do not pile bags of garbage on top of or around the cart.
- X Do not place unacceptable items in your garbage cart, including solvents, paints, sharps (medical needles), dead animals, hot ashes, or flammable liquids. (See Hazardous Waste on page 7 & 8)
- ✓ Do bag and tie trash to prevent litter from flying out.
- ✓ Do contain animal waste and cat litter in plastic bags.

For cart repairs or replacement, call 352-338-3233.

Official Yellow Bags

Excess garbage must be placed in Official Yellow Bags and set out for collection near your garbage cart. Purchase bags at Publix. Each Official Yellow Bag holds approximately 30 gallons of garbage and has a weight limit of 40 pounds per bag. Excess waste set out in personal containers, boxes or not in Official Yellow Bags, will not be collected.

Right Size Your Garbage Cart

Households are billed for trash pickup based on cart size. Unincorporated Alachua County residents are charged annually on their Property Tax Bill. City of Gainesville Residents will see charges on their GRU bills. Call 352-338-3233 to see if you can save money by switching to a smaller cart.

Households are billed for trash pickup based on cart size. Call the Office of Waste Collection at 352-338-3233 to see if you can save money by switching to a smaller cart.



Curbside Special Pickup

Bulk Items

Bulk Items that are too large to fit in your garbage cart or an Official Yellow Bag must be placed 4 ft. from your garbage cart and recycle bins. These items can include bicycles, plastic play sets, tables, chairs, sofas, desks, mattresses, etc.

Appliances

Residents who would like appliances such as stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators and freezers picked up must call the Office of Waste Collection at 352-338-3233 to schedule a free pickup.

Refrigerators and freezers must be empty. Remove doors, or securely close doors with tape or zip ties to prevent accidental lock-ins.

Interior Home Repair Material

Interior Home Repair Material (2 cubic yards max) such as cabinets, ceiling fans, inside doors, molding trim, sinks and toilets are eligible for curbside pickup. Carpet must be cut and rolled in 5 ft. sections weighing less than 40 lbs. each.

For Exterior Construction & Demolition material ie. fencing and siding, see page 11.

Moving or taking an extended vacation?

When you move, please leave your cart and recycling bins behind for new tenants to use. If taking an extended vacation – 90 days or more – you may be eligible for a vacation credit by petitioning Alachua County for a refund at the end of the fiscal year. Call the Office of Waste Collection at 352-338-3233 for more information.



Yard Waste Curbside Collection

Place yard waste curbside in reusable containers or in paper lawn & leaf bags, set 4 ft. from your garbage cart on your designated trash collection day. Reusable containers include plastic or metal collection bins available from most home goods or home improvement stores. Paper lawn & leaf bags are available at your local Publix Super Markets, Lowe's, The Home Depot, and other retailers.

Yard waste includes:

- ✓ Leaves
- ✓ Grass and shrub clippings
- ✓ Small tree limbs (smaller than 5 ft. long, 8 inches in diameter, and 40 lbs. each piece or bundled)



Yard waste does not include:

- X Boards, fencing, landscape timbers, or lumber
- X Dirt, rocks, brick, or concrete

Cans or bundles should not exceed 40 lbs. each. Yard waste should never be placed on the street or in storm drains.

Oversized yard waste can be collected by GFL for a fee. Call 352-377-0800 for an estimate.



Tips for a Waste-Free Yard

It is important to properly dispose of yard waste because you can divert it from entering the landfill while helping to replenish soil nutrients.

Instead of putting your yard waste to the curb, try a few different tricks to maintain a waste-free yard.

- Use a mulching mower blade to cut your grass and leaves into smaller clippings. Your lawn will decompose them, producing an environmentally healthy lawn that is nutrient rich.
- Use leaves and small shrub trimmings as mulch or add to your backyard compost pile.
- Use small limbs and branches as kindling or fuel for your fire pit or grill.

Recycling Curbside Collection

HAZARDOUS WASTE RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL.



Hazardous Waste Collection Center (HWCC)

The Alachua County Solid Waste and Resource Recovery Department offers a free service to Alachua County households for the proper disposal and recycling of household hazardous waste. Some of the items that may be brought to the Hazardous Waste Collection Center include:

- Batteries of all types
- Automotive Fluids and Oil Filters
- Flammable Products (gasoline, solvents)
- Electronic Scrap (E-Scrap) including TVs and computer monitors
- Fluorescent Lamps and CFLs (Compact Florescent Lamps)
- Paint Products
- Pharmaceuticals and Sharps (needles)
- Poisons, Pesticides, Pool Chemicals

E-Scrap

Consumer electronics contain a variety of heavy metals and other substances known to pose hazards to human and environmental health. Non-working or obsolete items such as TVs, computers, printers, cell phones, etc. should be dropped off at the HWCC or Rural Collection Centers. There is no charge for this service for Alachua County residents (a fee applies for businesses). If items are still in good working condition, please consider donating to your local thrift store.

Rural Collection Centers (RCCs)

The RCCs are rural, regional facilities for the collection of recyclables, solid waste, yard waste, bulk items, and household hazardous waste. These facilities are for residential use only. There is a limit of one visit per day. The load limit is one level truck bed per day of any combination of bagged household garbage, yard waste, or any other accepted item. See page 12 for the five collection centers' addresses and phone numbers. Contact your local RCC for a complete list of accepted items.

Leveda Brown Environmental Park and Transfer Station

If you are over your load limit for the RCCs, or if you have a prohibited item (such as a tire), visit the Transfer Station. Here, you can dispose of appliances, tires, garbage, and yard waste for a processing fee.

While you are visiting the Leveda Brown Environmental Park, you can also pick up some mulch for your yard. Mulch is available free of charge - just bring a truck or container to haul the load!

APARTMENTS, CONDOS OR MOBILE HOME PARKS.

If you live in a multi-family residence, you may have a centralized garbage and recycling station in your complex. Check with your property's management for garbage and recycling options.



Dual Stream Commercial

Many complexes have large 96 gallon carts or even dumpster size containers with signs indicating what type of recycling material goes in each bin.



Single Stream Commercial

Your complex may contract with a waste hauler that does not follow dual stream (Orange & Blue) recycling separation rules. This material is not processed by the County. With any bins, be sure to read the signs to recycle right.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING DROP OFF...

Some County residents do not have curbside service, or choose to dispose of items on their own, instead of waiting for curbside pickup. County residents may drop off material at the Transfer Station (for a fee) or bring one level truck bed load per day of residential garbage to one of the Rural Collection Centers for no additional cost.
