




Monitoring local groundwater, surface waters, and Wastewater




Protecting the Natural Resources of Alachua County

- In 2019:
- 600 site visits per year
- 1400 building permit reviews per year
- 168 development review projects per year
- 41 Enforcement cases
- Adopted Countywide Wetland Protection Code

Activities in FY19 and FY20:

- Adopted new dock code
- Evaluation and Appraisal associated Comp Plan changes:
 - Proposing larger OFW buffers
 - open space
 - tree and habitat protection
 - Resilient landscaping
 - Springs protection
 - Greenway planning
- Will follow-up in FY20 with associated code changes
- Outreach (World Wetlands Day, Art Contest)

Pollution Prevention Division - Storage Tanks Compliance







- State-funded petroleum storage tank compliance inspection program.
- Prevent groundwater contamination.
- Sixteen county service area managed by Alachua County.
- 1,295 registered petroleum storage tank facilities.
- 4 inspectors conduct 724 routine compliance inspections annually.
- Installation, closure, discharge, and complaint inspections.
- Funds 5 local jobs with a \$466,580 budget.

Desired Outcome: Clean Water

1 gallon of gasoline can contaminate
1,000,000
gallons of water

Pollution Prevention Division - Petroleum Cleanup







- State-funded clean-up of petroleum hydrocarbon contaminated sites.
- Performance-based contract with FDEP.
- Clean up petroleum-impacted soil & groundwater.
- Eleven county service area managed by ACEPD.
- Technical and financial oversight of environmental contractors.
- 406 petroleum contaminated sites.
- Average cost of clean-up is ~ \$400,000 per site.
- Funds 11 local jobs with a \$1.1 million budget.
