### Leveda Brown Environmental Park

- Officially opened in January of 1999
- Hub of Alachua County's solid waste system
- Elements of park
  - Transfer Station
  - Materials Recovery Facility
  - Household Hazardous Waste
  - Fleet Management facility
  - Drop off for white goods, scrap metal, tires, and yard waste
  - Solar installation



# **Transfer Station**



- Receives between 600-750 tons/day
- Transfer waste to long haul trailers to transport waste to New River Landfill.
- Accepts household and commercial waste.



# **Materials Recovery Facility**



- Taken over by Alachua County in 2014
- Previously SP Recycling
- Dual sort system
- Received approximately 18,193 tons in FY19 (includes residential & commercial)



# Household Hazardous Waste

- Opened in 2009
- Operated by the Alachua County Environmental Protection Department.
- Accepts hazardous waste from residential applications and, for a fee, small businesses.
- Examples: florescent lights, poisons, flammable liquids, corrosives, automotive fluids, heavy metal batteries, electronics, paint, etc.



# **Fleet Management Facility**

- Operated by Fleet Management
- Maintains and repairs long haul tractors and trailers, heavy equipment, and UF waste collection trucks.



# Drop off area

- White goods (large appliances)
  - Provides removal of refrigerants
- Tires
- Scrap metal
- Yard waste



• Mulched and given away for free



# **Solar Installation**



- Installed in 2009
- 25 kw system
- Operates on municipal feed in tariff

- Method of funding services provided
  - Rural Collection Centers
  - Curbside Collection
  - Solid Waste Management
  - Special Paving Projects
  - Neighborhood Preservation and Enhancement District



# **Curbside Contract**

- Waste collection agreement
  - Provide customer service
  - Assess liquidated damages
  - Work with hauler to provide efficient collection of garbage, recycling, yard waste, and bulk items





# **Code Enforcement**

- Enforce terms of the curbside contract
- Enforce Chapter 75 of the Alachua County Code of Ordinances

# State Reporting

- Annual Solid Waste Report required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- Compiles disposal and recycling data for residential, commercial, and institutional entities
- Monitors progress towards 75% recycling by 2020 goal
- Current Alachua County recycling rate 68%

# **Engineering and Compliance**

- Oversight and technical expertise on solid waste management activities, programs, and processes.
- Oversees capital improvement projects
- Permit compliance
- Closed landfill compliance monitoring
- Manages closure/post closure fund



# **Eco-Industrial Park**

- Industrial site for the processing of discarded materials, creation of new products, and research of waste reduction methods, techniques, and strategies.
- 37 acre site
- Initial horizontal infrastructure currently being installed



# **Eco-Industrial Park**

- At full buildout potential to support between 2,000 and 3,300 jobs (280-470 jobs on site)
- Potential economic output of \$180-320 million/year
- Potential to add \$12-25 million/year in local and state taxes
- Brings good paying jobs to the eastside of Gainesville and the County
