## EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 2020-07 ESTABLISHING A BURN BAN ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, Emergency Order 2020-01 declared a local state of emergency based on the COVID-19 virus on March 16<sup>th</sup>; and,

WHEREAS, the number of cases in the State of Florida, Alachua County and the counties that surround Alachua County continue to climb; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to §252.38(5)(a) Florida Statutes, provides that the County has the authority to take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public; and,

WHEREAS, it is crucial for the public safety and welfare that First Responders be available for medical calls during this time and not have to be responding to brush fires which are preventable; and,

WHEREAS, the burning of leaves, yard waste and other debris can necessitate an emergency response diverting otherwise crucial first response resources; and,

WHEREAS, the Chair of the County Commission is the Official Authority as prescribed in the County's Code §27.07; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to §252.38(1), Florida Statutes provides that the County shall have jurisdictional authority over the entire county.

## THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. There is a burn ban in place for the duration of this emergency and no yard waste, leaves or other material may be burned; and
- 2. This ban shall not apply to contained grills or griddles used for preparing food on a private or commercial basis; and
- 3. This order shall apply throughout the entire geographic boundary of Alachua County and within each municipality therein.
